The paragraph `<p>` tag

The `<p>` **tag** defines a paragraph of text. It is a block-level element and **always starts on a new line**. Before and after each paragraph, browsers add margin automatically. You can modify the margins using the CSS margin property .



Ordered List

<ol>  
  <li>Coffee</li>  
  <li>Tea</li>  
  <li>Milk</li>  
</ol>
```

ordered list

1. Coffee
2. Tea
3. Milk



Lists with Item Markers

value	Description
disc	Sets the list item marker to a bullet (default)
circle	Sets the list item marker to a circle
square	Sets the list item marker to a square
none	The list items will not be marked



List Example: Item Marker Styles

- I. Coffee
- II. Tea
- III. Coca Cola
